



2023 Summary of Motions

Feb -

- MOTION: Renew membership with American Horse Council at a cost of \$300. Unanimously approved.
- MOTION: To award webpage redesign to Paul Sternberg at a cost of \$3000 (\$1500 at inception and \$1500 at completion). Unanimously approved.

April-

MOTION: TO SPEND \$305 FOR A VHC TABLE AT THE SEPTEMBER AGENCY OF NATURAL RESOURCES CONFERENCE. THE MOTION WAS TABLED, PENDING MORE INFORMATION.

June -

• Motion was made to cancel the 2023 Summit. The motion was unanimously approved.

Aug –

Motion to allocate \$240 to register Board member, Jim Robinson, to attend Vermont Trails and Greenways symposium on September 27 & 28, 2023. Voted via email to approve expenditure.



COMMUNICATION -

1. Improve VHC communication through the rejuvenation and update of the VHC webpage by year end 2023 at a cost per budget.

March – April – Request for proposal and web designer selection

<u>April – May – 1</u>) Determine website map and content with guidance from web designer; 2) identify and welcome a new VHC webmaster to take over duties effective July 2023

<u>May – July</u> – Complete design and populate pages with content <u>July –</u> Launch new web page

<u>August</u> – Dec – receive feedback and fine tune content/pages

- 2. Reinstate quarterly VHC newsletter and start relevant periodic emails to membership via Mail chimp, Canva, or Constant Comment
- 3. Revamp Ride & Drive program to solicit excitement, fun and community for VHC members.



TRAILS -

Formalize equestrian trails in Willoughby State Forest by year end 2023
 Feb - meet with ANR to determine next steps needed to formalize equestrian trails and make a plan

<u>June</u> – complete site visit with ANR for the purpose of determining trails, parking and public comment content and date

July – Aug – prepare public comment documents and presentation

<u>Sept- Oct</u> – conduct public comment meeting

<u>Oct – Dec</u> – update all trail maps and master plan for phased approach of trail system and possible equestrian camping site

- 2. Continue discussion and development of Coolidge State Park equestrian camping and associated trail mapping.
- 3. Groton Forest initiatives -1) VHC trail marking and updating of maps, 2) maintenance on horse corral footing at New Discovery
- 4. Silver Lake 1)installation of two corrals, 2) maintenance of equestrian camping site, 3) investigation of addition trails at Silver Lake/Mooselamoo/Green Mountain Forest
- 5. Assure equine voice is present within Vermont Greenways organization
- 6. Complete Members Benefit private property trail access program.



EDUCATION -

- 1. Conduct an equine educational event per quarter
 - Winter Annual meeting Mongol Derby
 - Spring Rider Fitness/Equine Fitness
 - Summer Trails App and Ride (Hack, Map & App)
 - Fall TBD
- 2. Investigate Large Animal Rescue revitalize VHC equipment utilization and awareness
- 3. Solicit and train new board members and officers to assure long term viability of VHC
- 4. Continue connection with business community by conducting Equine Summit



ADMINISTRATION -

- 1. Assure BOD/membership meetings are held every other month throughout the year with minutes reported on the VHC webpage
- 2. Assure proper 501-3C filings are completed on time
- 3. Assure proper liability and D&O insurance is obtained in a timely fashion
- 4. Assure financial documents meet all state and federal requirements



Year in Review- Trails Committee

Trails Committee

- Silver Lake corrals installed for trail riding
- Worked with landowner and contractors to plan improvements to Jericho Research Trails for 2024 grant proposals
- Developed in depth proposal for expanding trail access at Willoughby State Forest in collaboration with Vermont Forest, Parks, and Recreation in 2024
- Expanded Trail access at Groton State Forest (Peacham Bog Loop)
- Obtained member only access to 2 properties with camping and riding locations on private property
- Trail Maintenance across the state
- Assisted local riding groups to maintain legal access to trail systems




